

Popular Thanksgiving Dishes in the U.S.



Apple Pie

The earliest printed recipe is from England. Apple pie is often served with whipped cream, ice cream. It is generally double-crust, with pastry both above and below the filling; the upper crust may be solid or lattice.

Mashed Potatoes

It is a dish made by mashing boiled potatoes, usually with added milk, butter, salt, and pepper.

Gravy

Ham

The goal is to reheat the ham without drying it out. The best way to do this is to place the ham on a rack in a roasting pan. Add water to the bottom of the pan and cover the whole thing tightly with foil. Bake at 325F for 16-20 minutes per pound, until a meat thermometer registers 135F.

Turkey

Stuffing

Stuffing is composed of herbs and a starch such as bread, used to fill a cavity in the preparation of another food item. Many foods may be stuffed, including poultry, seafood, and vegetables.

Boil sweet potatoes until tender, add warm milk and mash until smooth and creamy, then stir in some butter and maple syrup for a deliciously sweet and simple.
